Hi Cynthia – when I drag a file in to a folder where a file with the same name exists my Mac throws up a warning asking if I want to keep both versions (answer usually yes!). The Mac then makes a tiny change to one of the file names by – from memory – adding an a at the end of the file name. Worth experimenting and trying it out.
